- Making cards for all occasions and dropping them off at places like Ronald McDonald House or The Gift of Life Transplant House
- Shoveling snow for neighbors
- Helping pack boxes with the Channel One Food Bank (<u>https://www.helpingfeedpeople.org/volunteer/</u>)
- Babysitting
- Christmas caroling in your neighborhood
- Preparing and delivering baked goods to neighbors
- Making a meal for someone in need (a family with a new baby, someone with an injury, etc.)
- Cleaning out your closets and donating items to Goodwill or Salvation Army
- Christmas decorating for a neighbor who needs help outside
- Picking up trash or garbage in nearby parks to spruce up the area
