# Scheduling a COVID-19 vaccination for your 12 to 15-year-old

#### Mayo Clinic

Children 13 and over can schedule an appointment through Patient Online Services. For 12-year-old children, a parent or guardian can schedule through their Patient Online Services caregiver account. Appointments can also be scheduled by calling 507-538-4040. If you or your child does not have a Patient Online Services Account, call Mayo Clinic Customer Assistance at 877-858-0398 to create one.

#### **Olmsted Medical Center**

Now available to patients 12 to 15 years of age: the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine. Parents can call 507-292-7300 to schedule an appointment for their child.

OMC will continue to vaccinate all patients 16 years of age and older. To schedule an appointment to receive the COVID-19 vaccine, please call 507-292-7300. Appointments will take place at the Rochester Northwest Clinic.

#### **Olmsted County Public Health**

Olmsted County Public Health is offering the COVID-19 vaccine to anyone who is eligible. Vaccine clinics are by appointment only and are first-come, first-serve.

The county's COVID-19 website page will be updated with new registration dates and times based on Olmsted County Public Health's vaccination allocation. View upcoming COVID-19 vaccination clinics at our website.
