

Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance 2022 Scholarship Application



Program Overview

The Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance is a non-profit, educational, and professional networking organization for women in the public finance industry. It is governed by a board of directors representing the areas of government, finance, banking and law. The Minnesota Chapter was founded in 2011 as a chapter of the national organization, Women in Public Finance.

What is Public Finance?

Public finance generally refers to how governments raise and spend money. Individuals who work in public finance help governments at all levels—national, state, and local—obtain the necessary financial resources to pay for services and building projects such as schools, roads, parks, water, police and fire protection, libraries and health care.

Scholarship Overview

The Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance Scholarship Program annually awards at least \$5,000 from our industry sponsors. In addition, this year the Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance will award the first annual Carolyn Drude | Ehlers Memorial Scholarship. Carolyn was a pioneer in public finance during her career with Ehlers, exceling in her work and joining the ranks of senior industry leadership during a time when the field was largely dominated by men. She was instrumental in paving the way for more women to pursue careers in public finance.

The total amount to be awarded and the amount of individual awards may vary. The **goals** of the scholarship program are to:

- 1) Recognize college-bound, female high school seniors and undergraduate students who have exhibited scholastic achievement (preferably with an established aptitude in mathematics) and demonstrated leadership skills;
- 2) Encourage the consideration of careers in finance and, more specifically, public finance; and
- 3) Provide an opportunity for scholarship recipients to meet women established in the public finance industry and learn about the career options and opportunities available in this important field.

Application

To *qualify* and *apply* for the Scholarship, the applicant must, at a minimum:

- 1) Identify as female;
- 2) Be graduating from a Minnesota high school or attending a Minnesota higher education institution and be entering her undergraduate freshman or sophomore year in the fall of 2022;
- 3) Have at least a 3.0 GPA or equivalent;
- 4) Exhibit leadership skills through extracurricular activities, volunteer positions, internships and/or other work experience;
- 5) Indicate an interest in pursuing a public finance related career in finance, government, nonprofits, banking or law;
- 6) Complete and submit the Scholarship application form, the required essays and a photocopy of your most recent unofficial high school OR college transcript, as appropriate, <u>VIA E-MAIL</u> to <u>info@mnwpf.com</u>. The application must be <u>RECEIVED</u> no later than 11:59 pm Central Time June 1, 2022.

Selection and Recognition

- The Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance will select recipients based on the qualifications of the candidates as demonstrated by the completed application and submitted essays.
- The Minnesota Chapter of Women in Public Finance may also elect to conduct phone interviews or seek additional information as part of the selection process.
- Scholarship recipients will be invited to accept the Scholarship at the Minnesota Women in Public Finance Annual Conference to be held in the Fall of 2022, the specific date to be determined. The conference will be held virtually or in downtown Minneapolis.

(Note: Attendance at the annual conference is not required to receive the Scholarship).

Scholarship recipients will be notified by approximately August 2, 2022.

<u>Option 1:</u> Evaluate a risk you have taken or an ethical dilemma you have faced and its impact on you. If applicable, describe how your actions or decisions impacted the community, your school, family or peer group.

Option 2: Describe your career and educational goals and who or what has influenced these goals.

<u>Option 3</u>: What does diversity mean to you? Describe an event or experience that challenged your point of view. How did this experience affect you and what do you believe to be the result of such experience?

Option 4: Describe an event in which you took a leadership role and what you learned about yourself.
